Comments:

- > Strong Paddocks on Signpost farms have been baled as silage where weather has allowed.
- > Paddocks have been topped where necessary to remove stem.
- Cleanout on paddocks is priority now to maintain quality in the swards before building grass covers.
- Focus is now turning to building grass cover on Signpost farms depending on stocking rate (*Table 1*)
- > Every additional week at grass will reduce total GHG emissions by 1%
- ➤ Every day at grass is worth approximately €2/head in the Autumn.

- > Ground conditions are holding on Signpost farms, but dry weather is needed to achieve cleanouts.
- ➤ Where ground conditions become difficult:
 - ✓ 12-hour grass allocations will be used
 - ✓ A back fence will be used where necessary.
 - ✓ All efforts will be made to maintain pre-grazing covers of 1300-1500 Kg/DM/Ha
